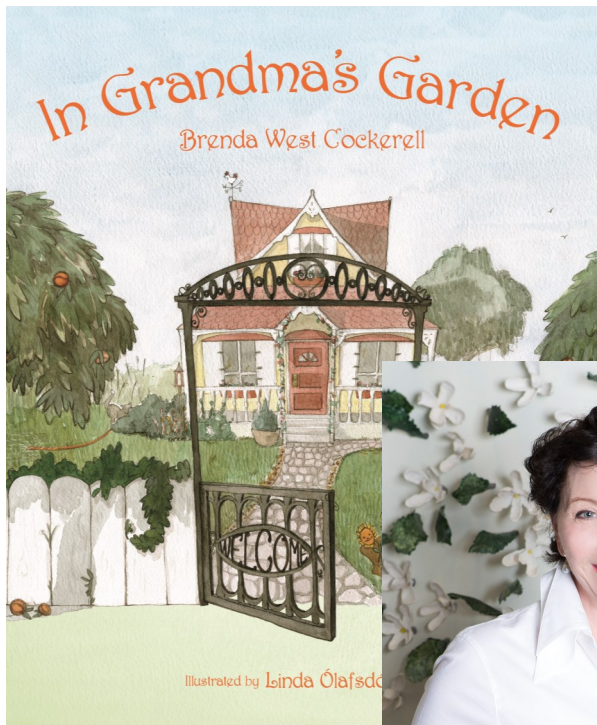


## Special Story Time

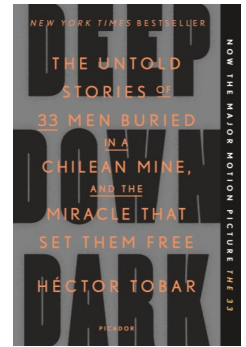

### "The Things They Carried" Community Book Discussion

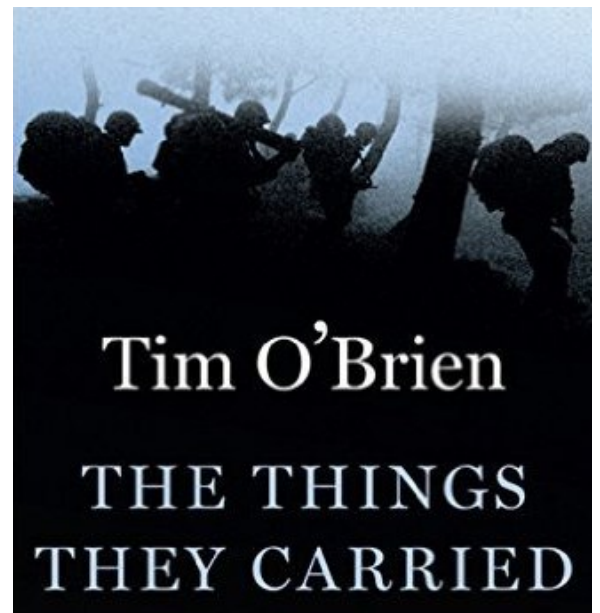
